Conference location

Torino enjoys an extraordinary geographical position, being surrounded by the gorgeous arc of the Western Alps to the North and West, with a nearby chain of hills forming a beautiful landmark to the East. The mountainous surrounds and close proximity of the Ligurian Sea inspired the famous architect Le Corbusier to call Torino "the city with the most beautiful natural position". Torino skilfully blends culture and taste, since here were created and are hosted the "Salone Internazionale del Libro" and "Salone Internazionale del Gusto". The city motto of Torino, coined during the 2006 Winter Olympics, is: *Passion lives here*.
