That was the inspiration to all of us in the Pilot Country's team to determine what could be accomplished, after have lost at least one string, with what remained. A very brief balance of the last five ITM meetings shows that we had always more than 100 registrations and papers presented from more than 20 countries, with participated discussions. The high quality of the scientific results presented has shown us the interest to continue and to make an additional effort to attract more scientists, especially young researchers. The participation of invited speakers and authors with recognised worldwide scientific merit had also help on the preparation of attractive programmes and on the long history of success of this meeting.

For these reasons, it will be a privilege to have the 29th International Technical Meeting on Air Pollution Modelling and Its Applications in the lively atmosphere of the University of Aveiro that will make your visit, for sure, unforgettable!
